

CONFLICT MINERALS STATEMENT

Vishay Intertechnology is a member of the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) and fully supports the position of the EICC and the Global e-Sustainability (GeSi) Initiative in avoiding the use of conflict minerals which directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries, in line with full compliance to the EICC's Electronic Industry Code of Conduct. Vishay Intertechnology will terminate business with any supplier if we determine that the supplier is directly or indirectly financing armed groups in the DRC or adjoining countries.

To date, Vishay Intertechnology has received responses from its suppliers stating that Gold, Tantalum, Tungsten or Tin does not originate from the DRC and adjoining countries or is DRC conflict free. Vishay is further working with our suppliers to identify the smelters and mine sources. Vishay will rely on the EICC/GeSi third party audits of smelters or other sources as part of its due diligence program and comply with the Dodd Franks Act and subsequent SEC requirement.
